Rick mentioned that it might be usable to have some water filters. Potable water might be at a premium. Water filters are easy to make and will come in handy. He also mentioned that you might take some sleeping bags or/and cots to sleep on at the shelters. This beats sleeping on cold concrete.

Anthony said that twin bed sheets would be a great accessory. They can be ripped up for bandages or for any other use. They are small and pack easily using only a little space.

Erik mentioned that a good had, to keep sun off of your head, ears and back of neck would be useful. He has a small battery pack, that has a solar panel to keep it charged, and he uses it for keeping his phone and small devices power up.
